It's that time of year again! IOV awarded 2021 Grand Lodge Scholarships of \$1,750.00 to six Junior Vikings. Applications for the 2022 scholarship awards open on November 1.

The application materials will be available on the IOV website, https://.iovikings.org.

The scholarship rules are shared in this Journal, and the application and checklist will be printed in the December Journal.

Every year we get contacted by students or parents who missed the deadline. Please make sure to add the scholarship dates to your calendar and promote through your club! We hope all our Junior Vikings have a great school year!

2022 SCHOLARSHIP TIMELINE

November 1, 2021

Scholarship Application Available from Fraternal Administrator or IOV website

March 1, 2022Scholarship Applications DUE

2022 VIKING SCHOLARSHIP RULES

All applications must be submitted and postmarked between November 1, 2021 and March 1, 2022

- **1)** The Viking Scholarship Fund was established on June 14, 1963 at the Grand Lodge Meeting held in Boston, Massachusetts.
- **2)** A Scholarship Committee of at least three (3) members shall be appointed by the Grand Chief and Vice Grand Chief to manage the Viking Scholarship Fund and to award yearly scholarships of not less than \$250.00.
- **3)** The Viking Scholarship Fund shall consist of monies received from fund raising events, donations or bequeaths from members, IOV lodges, friends of Vikings and accumulated interest on investments.
- 4) Scholarship Applications:
 - **a)** The applicant must hold either a Junior or Senior Membership in the Independent Order of the Vikings for at least six (6) months prior to the date of application.
 - **b)** The applicant must have dues/assessments paid up through December 31st of the year the scholarship is awarded.
 - **c)** The Financial Secretary of the subordinate lodge must certify the applicants name, lodge, certificate number and paid to date.
 - **d)** The applicant must be a high school senior who has received confirmation of acceptance from an institute of higher learning. If the recipient does not attend an institute of higher learning, the dollar amount of the scholarship check shall be returned to the Independent Order of Vikings
 - **e)** The applicant shall send the completed application form and lodge certification form to their high school.
 - **f)** The high school will submit a certified copy of high school grades (transcript) with the application forms and student evaluation to the IOV Fraternal Administrator.
 - **g)** Current application forms shall be available from the Fraternal Administrator or the IOV website on November 1, 2021.
 - **h)** Applications for scholarships shall be submitted to the Grand Lodge office from November 1, 2021 to March 1, 2022.
 - i) Incomplete applications will not be judged by the adjudicators.
 - j) Applications will be judged on their merits.

ALL APPLICATIONS POSTMARKED AFTER THE MARCH 1, 2022 DEADLINE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED!

- **5)** A panel of independent adjudicators will judge all applications and determine the qualifications of the applicants.
- **6)** The Viking Scholarship Committee shall determine the number of recipients that will be awarded a Viking Scholarship.
- **7)** The Viking Scholarship Committee shall have the power to make any additional rules to help in the selection of recipients.
- **8)** The scholarship recipients shall be announced at the first Executive Council Meeting after judging is complete. The scholarship check will be made payable to the recipient and paid in time for the fall semester.
- **9)** These rules apply for the application year <u>**2022</u>**. Scholarship rules and amount of the awards will be reviewed and updated yearly by the Executive Council of the Independent Order of Vikings.</u>

What I Love About Being a Viking

We had many camping trips to Camp Hillcrest, in the early 70's we had our installation of officers and Grand Chief Paul Swanson installed me along with Past Grand Chief Arvid Soderberg. In fact, Arvid stayed overnight with Dee and me. Then there were the trips to Lodbrok Lodge in Lake Forest for their annual Christmas party, lots of lutefisk and way too much Glogg. We used to go to the fried herring breakfast in Crystal Lake, IL and also Batavia.

I have traveled to conventions in Omaha, Rockford, Tinley Park, Muskegon, Jamestown, and Braintree. One the most memorable trips was in 1989, when Dee and I were celebrating our 25th wedding anniversary, so we traveled to Niagara Falls and then went to the convention in Jamestown, NY. I remember staying up until 4:30 in the morning. I remember that Debbie and Bill, also some of our Vikings members, built a scarecrow dressed in blue with a Sigurd lodge t-shirt and, as you entered the park it was surrounded by aluminum cans (I'm sure you know what kind of beverage that was).
