Rod Ottum Grand Chief

Fellow Vikings,

It feels a little strange to be submitting an article as Grand Chief. For those who don't know me yet, let me share a little information about myself and how I became a Viking. I have been married to my wife Delaine (Dee) for nearly 58 years. We have two sons: Roddee resides in Minneapolis and Jason, along with his wife Kerry, reside in Kenosha. We have one grandson, Cal, who is attending Arizona State and was a Grand Lodge Scholarship recipient last year. Both my sons and Cal have been Vikings since around age one, and my wife Dee became a Viking in 1973 when we changed our bylaws to admit women. I was admitted to the Vikings in June of 1969, along with my brother-in-law and his father. When they voted on us I was "black balled" (rejected) three times! After the first vote, they revoted and I was rejected a second time, then a third time! When the Chief and Vice Chief checked the ballot box the third time they both over looked it and accepted me. I guess there was a member who had been at the bar for happy hour a little too long and couldn't recognize the difference between the white balls and black balls. I guess, technically, I'm a member illegally. (ha, ha!)

In December of 1969 I was asked to serve as a guard by our Chief Jim Hansen, which I did for a couple of years and then served as Financial Secretary for several years. I was then elected Chief and served for about 40 years. I was elected to the Grand Lodge Executive Council in June of 2007 and then elected Vice Grand Chief in June of 2019. I was to be installed as Grand Chief in Kenosha in June of 2021 but the Convention was delayed due to the Covid pandemic. I became Grand Chief on January 1, upon the resignation of our past Grand Chief Mindy Worden.

I will be "officially" installed as Grand Chief in Kenosha at our convention October 6-8. We've moved the convention to October because, according to GBU bylaws, new officers will now assume their duties on January 1st. I will be the first Grand Chief from Wisconsin which, at one time, also had a lodge in Milwaukee. History is being made along with our prospective merger with GBU.

You may be wondering, "who is GBU?" GBU Financial Life is a company who specializes in life insurance and annuity products with a focus on fraternal activity. As of this writing we are <u>not</u> officially merged. We are in the final stages of seeking approval from the state departments of insurance in Illinois (where IOV is incorporated) and Pennsylvania (where GBU is incorporated). This is something the executive council has been working on for the last few years and it will be great for the IOV! After the merger is final, GBU will be sending you information about their products and member benefits, which are optional to Vikings. From what I've been told and have seen, it would be well worth checking out. Stay tuned for more info, or check out their website at <u>www.gbu.org.</u>

As I reminisce on what my old Viking neighbor and great friend Ernie Haggmark would think about me being elected Grand Chief he would probably say, "Rod, take care of the IOV." Shortly before he passed away he said, "Rod, take care of the Lodge," which I feel I have done. So now I will try to take care of the Grand Lodge to the best of my ability. Ernie would attend most of the conventions and Past Grand Chief C. Henry




